Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of PREMSAGAR MERCHANTS PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2013, and the Statement of Profit and Loss and Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performance and cash flows of the Company in accordance with the Accounting Standards referred to in sub-section (3C) of section 211 of the Companies Act, 1956 ("the Act"). This responsibility includes the design, implementation and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the Company's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- b) In the case of the Profit and Loss Account, of the loss for the year ended on that date; and
- c) In the case of the Cash Flow Statement, of the cash flows for the year ended on that date.

 - e) On the basis of written representations received from the directors as on March 31, 2013, and taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on March 31, 2013, from being appointed as a director in terms of clause (g) of sub-section (1) of section 274 of the Companies Act, 1956.

Based on information and explanation furnished to us and record examined by us in the normal course of audit, we also report that to the best of our Knowledge and belief:

- (i) (a) The Company has maintained proper records showing full particulars including quantitative details and situation of Fixed Assets.
- (b) The fixed assets of the company have been physically verified by the management at reasonable intervals. No material discrepancies were noticed on such verification.

- (xviii) The company did not have any debenture outstanding during the year.



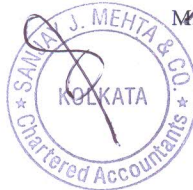

A SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 Accounting Concepts, Conventions & Systems

3 Fixed Assets & Depreciation

Free Hold land/Lease Hold Land is stated as original cost of acquisition, inclusive of all incidental expenses thereto.

4 BORROWING COST

Borrowing Costs attributable to the fixed assets during their construction are capitalized. Such borrowing costs are debited to Capital-Work-in-Progress to be capitalized on completion of the project. Other Borrowing costs are charged to the Profit and Loss statement, if any.

5 PRIOR PERIOD ITEMS:

Prior period items (if any) are shown under the head Prior period adjustment in Profit & Loss Statement and Balance Sheet as the case may be.

6 PROVISIONS, CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS

Contingent Liabilities are disclosed by way of notes in the Balance Sheet. Provision is made in the accounts in respect of those contingencies which are likely to be materialised into liabilities after the year end, till the finalisation of accounts and have material effect on the position stated in the Balance Sheet. Basic EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year. Diluted EPS is computed by dividing the net profit or loss for the year by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year as adjusted for the effects of dilutive potential equity shares except where the results are anti-dilutive.
